"I didn't start looking at VCSU until my junior year of high school" said Steph. "When I came to Valley City for my visit, I fell in love with the campus and everyone I met was just so welcoming. I knew I wanted to major in education and a large majority of my teachers attended VCSU -- they all recommended the education program. I loved the




