V-500: A Shining Success Since 1972

They often say that "good things don't happen by accident." That is certainly the case when it comes to VCSU's V-500 Scholarship Program.

It was certainly no accident back in 1972 when a group of visionaries come together to put in place the beginnings of the V-500 scholarship program at Valley City State University! The group was committed to providing scholarship assistance to students at the university.

Early reports tell us that in the first year a total of \$75,000 was raised for the program. Scholarships in the amount of \$75 were awarded, and the program was off and running. The initial program required a payment of \$50 per year for a 10-year time period. Scholarships today range from \$1,500 to \$2,500 annually. Memberships are typically for a 4-year time period.

The founders of the program included Art Arfoe, Dean Lenaburg, Dale Sorenson, Neil McDonald, Orville Barber, Carol Peterson, Curtis Olson, Calvin Foss, Janet Wick, Jim Swanke, Bob Ingstad, Dorothy Langemo, John Carlisle, and Willard Richman.

Since those humble beginnings in 1972, the program has grown to offer in excess of \$265,000 in scholarship support for the current 2017–18 academic year. There are over 300 active V-500 members today. Many individuals and businesses have multiple memberships. Some folks have contributed over \$75,000 to the program. Others have elected to include V-500 in their estate plans.

Over the 45-year history of the program, more than 6,000 students have benefited from V-500 scholarships. Last academic year alone, 150 students received V-500 scholarships. The program has become the envy of many other institutions in the region. Without a doubt, V-500 has been a key factor in the record enrollment that the university has enjoyed the past several years.

According to Larry Robinson, executive director of university

advancement, "We owe a debt of gratitude to the founders of V-500. They were clearly visionaries and had the students at VCSU at heart. Their work lives on and is 'Making a Difference' in the lives of our students." Robinson further noted, "We often say, 'It Takes Two, V-500 and You.'" Those words were true in 1972 and remain true today!

Although the past is history, the future of V-500 is very promising, stated Robinson. "The program has taken on a life of its own. More and more folks are seeing V-500 as a way to give something back. We have had V-500 scholarship recipients graduate, enter the field of education, and then become members of V-500 themselves. Still others take advantage of the tax incentives by contributing to this worthy cause, either while they are still living or through their estate plans. V-500 has clearly become a part of who we are as an institution."

Robinson attributes the success of the program to a number of factors. "We are fortunate to enjoy strong support from our alumni and friends and the greater Valley City/Barnes County business community. Our donors care deeply about VCSU and want to do their part in helping our students obtain a college degree and minimize their student debt. We have also had long list of dedicated and committed V-500 board members. These volunteers have been the real troopers, giving of their time, talent, and treasure, to insure the on-going success of the program."

Erica Bunn, VCSU controller and current president of the V-500 Board of Directors, was a recipient of a V-500 scholarship while a student here at VCSU. According to Erica, "In my position in the VCSU Business Office, I see many students that count on the scholarship support provided by V-500. There is no doubt that many of these students would not be attending VCSU without that support."

Robinson further noted that board member Dean Pedersen has, on his own, generated in excess of \$250,000 for the V-500 program. According to Robinson, "Words cannot express the commitment Dean has made to this program. He epitomizes the very best of what V-500 is all about!"
